Scholarship

The Manukau Institute of Technology (MIT) in partnership with Te Tohu Taakaro o Aotearoa Charitable Trust offers two scholarships of up to \$6,000 each to a candidate of Māori descent for study at MIT in 2018.

Criteria

Applicants should be actively involved in sports either as a sports person; or in sports administration or in a coaching role.

Applicants do not necessarily have to excel in sport at an elite level; rather they should be seeking tertiary education to assist/enhance their career goals by enrolling in a programme of study at MIT.

The scholarship will be awarded based on the following:

- The candidate must be of Māori descent and show an interest to their Iwi, Hapū, Whānau and Te Reo Māori me ōna Tikanga.
- The candidate must attend a formal interview at MIT
- The candidate must be aged 16 years or older
- Must be enrolled for Semester 1, 2018 start
- The successful candidate must attend the ceremony in which their scholarship will be awarded to them.

NOTE:

Students seeking to enrol in a University of Auckland or Unitec at Manukau programme will NOT be eligible to apply for the MIT Māori Sports Awards Scholarship.

Process

- All candidates must have applied for their preferred programme of study at the Manukau Institute of Technology (MIT).
- The candidate must attend a formal interview at MIT.
- Judging will be determined by the MIT Kaitakawaenga Māori, and the Chief Executive Officer (CEO) of Te Tohu Taakaro o Aotearoa Charitable Trust.
- The decision made by the judging panel will be final and no correspondence will be entered into at the conclusion of this decision.
- All applicants will be notified in writing of the decision of the judging panel.

Assessment of application/s

The judging panel will assess all applications based on three criteria:

- Work Ethic
- Financial Need/Hardship
- Study History

Applicants are encouraged to use Te Reo Māori in making their application, but this will not be a criteria on which they are judged.

Supporting evidence

Supporting evidence is essential for each of the three criteria. This could be in the form of a letter from a teacher, employer, careers advisor, sports coach, or tutor commenting on your attitude, commitment or potential. Students should include a copy of their most recent report. Any form of document that supports the statements that the applicant has made in their application should be included. A lengthy CV is not necessary.

Work ethic

In the work ethic section the judging panel considers an applicant's commitment, dedication and attitude towards learning, working and achieving. Examples could include on-going commitment to a job (full-time/part-time/paid/voluntary), a sports team/club (regular attendance), or towards study (a good attitude towards school work).



Financial need/hardship

In this section the judging panel will consider evidence that displays an applicant's difficulty to pay their tuition fees.

Applicants could demonstrate this by stating the number of dependents in their family. In addition, an applicant may have other siblings in tertiary training who are supported by their parents. Applicants who are living with their parents should also state whether or not their parents are in paid employment.

In this section, applicants must also disclose whether or not they have applied for other sources of funding. They do not need to know the outcome of their other applications. All applicants should provide appropriate documentation to verify why they feel that this scholarship will be beneficial to them financially, e.g. the appropriate documentation could include bank statement/s.

The judging panel will consider all documentation submitted by the applicant.

Study history

Study history refers to the candidate's aptitude to learning. All candidates may wish to use supporting documents in the form of:

- School reports
- Examination and assessment results
- Academic reference/letter from a teacher/dean or HOD
- NZQA record of learning

Students should include a copy of their last report as well as results from examinations and formal assessments.

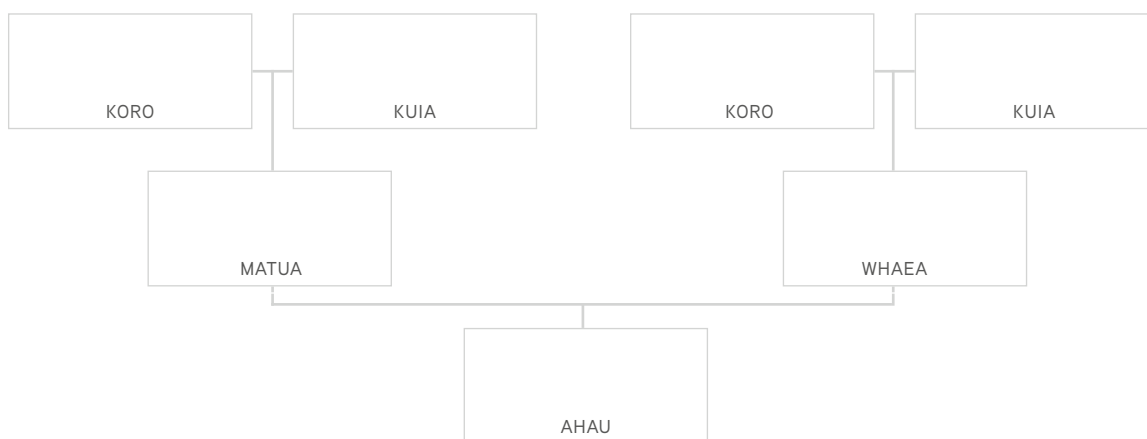
