



Albert Paurini Wharepapa (Opai) Asher

Ngāti Pukenga, Ngāti Pikiao, Te Whetu-o-te-Rangi



Tauranga's supreme athlete of the 20th century?

Albert Arapeta Paurini Asher was born on 3 December 1879 at Tauranga to Katerina Rahera (daughter of Te Atirau Rahera me Paurini Te Whatarau and whangai to Hone Te Atirau) and David Asher (a native agent, licensed interpreter and storekeeper at Tauranga) and was the fifth of eleven children.

Albert was educated at Tauranga School, a child prodigy on the rugby field who became a prominent sportsman, excelling particularly in rugby union and rugby league.

Albert Asher was only 11½ years old when he played his first senior Rugby representative game, playing for Tauranga against Rotorua. Eighteen months later, still under 13 years, he played against Auckland - the youngest senior representative on record.

In 1908, together with his brother Ernest, he formed a Māori team to tour Australia, accompanied by tribal leaders. Upon the team's arrival in Sydney, they were greeted by New South Wales Rugby League officials, who convinced them to change codes immediately. Until 1913, Albert Asher was a New Zealand representative at rugby league, and he and Ernest established the City Rovers League Club.

Through Paralympic TEAM Para sport, lives are transformed

Aotearoa New Zealand has a rich history of participation in the Paralympic Games since 1968. The Paralympic Games are a multi-sport event for disabled athletes which take place after each edition of the Olympic Games, in the same city. They are the largest event worldwide for driving social change and the third largest sporting event in the world.

Over the past 55 years, the NZ Paralympic Team has been successful at the Paralympics, punching above its weight on the world stage, and winning 236 medals across various sports such as Para athletics, Para cycling, and Para swimming. In Tokyo 2020, the NZ Paralympic Team won 12 medals and placed 3rd in the world for gold medals per capita and 4th in the world for overall medals per capita. In Rio 2016, the NZ Paralympic Team won 21 medals, finishing 13th on the overall medal table, and first in the world for medals per capita. This was the best ever result for a summer Paralympic Games on the medals table.

Kiwis have every reason to be excited for the next Paralympics Games in August 2024 in Paris.
